On Sunday, the 26th annual Australian Premier Working Dog Auction was held at Island Park for the first time in two years. After two years of no physical auctions due to the global pandemic it was such a pleasure to look around the Working Dog demonstration arena and see so many people just watching and truly enjoying our Breeders work their dogs prior to the 26th annual Australian Premier Working Dog Auction.

Our hard work has continued over the last couple of years maintaining the momentum and energy and communicating with our Vendor's, sponsors and prospective purchasers. The catalogue this year was very good with 53 of the best working dogs Australia has to offer going to auction.

To say we are just a little bit proud to have broken yet another World Record clearing a total of \$407,000 for the auction would be an understatement. We successfully sold 46 dogs which gave us an average of \$8,848 overall.

Congratulations to Kahlee O'Leary on claiming the Highest Priced Dog in 2022 with Kimmy selling for \$27,000 to our youngest ever Purchaser's in brother and sister duo Ashley & Lachlan Meaburn from Tasmania, and Paul Macphail headed up the pups with the sale of 15-week-old Monty for an impressive \$6,000. We look forward to the continued support of these vendors next year.

Our association utilising the online AuctionsPlus platform provides the opportunity for purchasers across the world to join the auction and bid. Some interesting facts from this year's auction are that our catalogue was viewed 25,282 times and we recorded 2,009 bids online with 19 dogs successfully sold online from 174 active bidders.

It is clear that the agricultural sector sees the value in these hard-working dogs, with our auction attracting a growing buyer market. Our auctioneers James Tierney and Bernie Grant were outstanding, with bids topping over \$10,000 on 14 occasions and selling dogs for over \$20,000 on three occasions.

But of course, the auction wouldn't happen without the support of our sponsors and our volunteers and we thank local Vet Jo Ward for her services throughout the weekend ensuring we meet our compliance requirements.


